Solicitors and Community Safety

Several residents have contacted the clubhouse office regarding solicitors in our neighborhood. Recently some solicitors gave residents an uneasy, unsafe feeling, and we have been asked if such solicitors are allowed in our neighborhood. Our CC&R's specifically state that, "solicitation of Hidden Grove Green Valley Homeowners Association members shall be prohibited, with the exception of local children conducting fund raising projects." We have signs by the clubhouse which state that there shall be no solicitation. Residents are more than within their rights to ask that such solicitors leave the neighborhood.

If any residents are approached by solicitors who will not leave or who make them uncomfortable, please try to get their name or the name of their business and their number and forward it to the office. We will be more than happy to contact them to make sure they know that there is no soliciting in Hidden Grove/Green Valley.

As residents of a community association, we are given the opportunity to communicate

with our neighbors (this newsletter is a good example), form a Neighborhood Watch Program, and benefit from community rules that our board of directors ensures are enforced. The only thing that keeps us from taking control of our community and eliminating vandalism, burglary and other community-based crime is 100% participation by all of the members of our community. Our neighborhood is much safer when we all keep an eye out on our neighbors house while they are away, report suspicious activity and/or persons to the office, and comply with our rules & regulations.

Outside Spring Cleaning Day Scheduled for Saturday, April 6th

When the board moved to eliminate street sweeping, they knew that it would fall to the residents to keep their sidewalks and streets clean. As an effort to continue keeping our neighborhood looking nice and kept up, the board has scheduled an outdoor spring cleaning day. On Saturday, April 6th, residents are invited to get outside and clean up their yard, and sidewalk. Any residents who are spotted working in their yards will

be given tickets to join us for pizza and soda in the clubhouse that evening. This will not only help make our neighborhood look nicer, it will also provide an opportunity for neighbors to meet each other and mingle in the clubhouse.

Pool Fobs and Pool Release

Our CC&R's state that residents and/or tenants must sign a release before they are granted entry to the pool. In an effort to be in compliance with our CC&R's, the board has moved that all pool fobs be deactivated until a release is signed. The release will be available for signature on May 1st, and after this date residents are invited to come to the clubhouse office during office hours to sign it. For our residents that are at work on weekdays, we will also be opening the clubhouse for a couple of evenings this spring. Details will follow regarding the dates we plan on doing this.
