Don't Forget to Vote on Amending the HG/GV Governing Documents

In June, 2013 and October, 2014, the Association was able to transfer to the City of Central Point two important assets: the water lines and the storm drains. This was a great accomplishment by the Board of Directors since maintenance of these assets could be extremely expensive and could have resulted in special assessments or increased dues for us, the Lot owners.

Beginning in 2015 a committee began reviewing the governing documents to reflect these changes. The Board then approved the changes and they were then emailed to a Portland attorney for legal review and suggestions, and the proposed changes modified accordingly.

The attorney was concerned that some of the language in the existing governing documents is antiquated and leaves our Homeowners Association exposed to lawsuits. Lawsuits can be expensive and could mean special assessments or increase in our monthly dues.

The next step in this lengthy and expensive process is to have the changes approved by the Members, or Lot owners, of the Homeowners Association. Ballots were mailed on February 4, 2017.

If you haven't already, please take the time to review and vote on the proposed changes. Help us avoid lawsuits by making our governing documents clear, accurate and in compliance with Oregon statutes. Clear, concise, correct and legal governing documents make living in our Association easier and more pleasant for all residents.

Please turn in your ballot as soon as possible. The Board of Directors would like all ballots returned by March 10th.



Reminder: The next Board meeting will be Wednesday March 15th at 600pm in the clubhouse. The Board of Directors is hoping to be able to conduct a final count of ballots at their March meeting.

CC&Rs Corner – Parking

This is a friendly reminder that a couple of years ago the Board passed 2 resolutions regarding parking within the subdivision.

Cars will be considered in violation of these resolutions:

- 1. If they are parked headed against the lawful direction of traffic.
- 2. If they are parked head-in in any area of the subdivision that is not marked for head-in parking. The only areas in the subdivision marked for head-in parking are the Clubhouse and the RV parking area. In all other areas, cars must be parked PARALLEL to the curb.

The Board felt the need to pass these resolutions for 3 reasons:

- 1) Those are the traffic regulations of the City of Central Point.
- 2) The neighborhood just looks nicer when cars are parked according to regular traffic regulations.
- 3) Safety.

Regarding parking going the wrong direction, the rule originates from safe parking at night; the rear of a car is required to have red reflectors to alert drivers to the presence of a parked car. Facing the wrong way without these red reflectors poses a greater hazard.

Residents might think there may be extra space and no one would be bothered when they park head-in. However, they have just reduced the turnaround ratio for other vehicles.
