Participating local contractors can complete the repairs at no cost after residents are pre-qualified. Eligible homes must be heated with electricity or gas from Pacific Power and cannot be on a permanent, attached foundation.

Oregon Shakespeare Festival Opens 2012 Season

ASHLAND, OR —The Tony Award-winning Oregon Shakespeare Festival's 2012 season opens in February. This marks the 77th season for the Oregon Shakespeare Festival.

The season opens Friday, February 24 with Shakespeare's tragedy Romeo and Juliet. This season the star-crossed lovers and their feuding families are set in the late 1840's Alta, California—showcasing the culture of the Spanish-speaking Californios, whose lifestyle is endangered as the United States military invades the Mexican territory, changing it forever.

Saturday the world premiere of The White Snake, takes the stage. In this adaptation of a beloved Chinese legend, a snake spirit disguised as a beautiful woman falls in love with a young scholar. White Snake keeps her true identity secret from him, but a disapproving monk persists in unmasking her.

Animal Crackers, the raucous 1930's vaudevillian musical farce made famous by the Marx Brothers will also open Saturday, February 25th. —and yes it will be funny!

Sunday afternoon a new adaptation of Anton Chekhov's Seagull opens. The play is a funny, heartbreaking and human story. Set in 19th century

Russia in which three generations of self-doubting artists hope for recognition from those they love.

"These opening four productions are deliciously different from one another," Artistic Director Bill Rauch notes, "and I can't wait to share them with audiences. They are a wonderful blend of old and new, tragedy and comedy, and the vastly divergent settings will transport audiences around the globe."
