Summer Presents the Perfect Time for House Painting

Many residents will take advantage of the long summer days to paint their homes. Painting is a great way to add real value to a home.

One of the most difficult aspects of painting a house is settling on a paint color or color scheme. Many exterior paint jobs have a least three colors - a main color, trim color and another color for accessories such as doors and shutters. Choosing a color scheme that fits with the neighborhood while at the same time showcasing individuality can be mind boggling. Some experts recommend driving around the neighborhood in order to view other paint colors that are appealing in order to narrow down what colors would work best. Color durability is also an important consideration. Certain colors, especially reds and blues are less durable and fade quicker. Reds and yellows require more coats than others. The best colors for color durability and color coverage are beige to light-medium brown, however it is most important to select a color that will bring out the best features of a home. The CC&R's of Hidden Grove/Green Valley require that any change in exterior colors must be presented to the HOA for approval prior to painting. Experts say that acquiring paint samples and applying them to the house is one of the most valuable things a homeowner can do. The average home requires \$500.00 worth of paint, and it can be quite discouraging if, once it is applied to the house, it is not pleasing to the homeowner. Sample boards can be quite helpful in narrowing down color choices. Once the color scheme has been decided upon, apply the paint samples to the house itself on a 2 x 2 foot square. Light and shadow make a big difference, as well as surrounding accessories, such brick work and decking. Paint the sample near these accessories to see how the colors play together. Check the samples in both light and shade and at all times of the day.

Estimate the amount of paint needed before heading to the store. Using cans of paint mixed at different times can result in obvious color differences. Determine the square footage of the home by measuring the area

of each side in a separate measurement (length x highest point), then total the square footage. As a general rule, exterior acrylic paint covers 250-300 sq. ft/gallon, but stucco or rough sawn lumber require 200-250 sq. ft/gallon after priming. Also, spraying will take 20% more paint than brushing and rolling. Using a primer will greatly reduce the amount of paint as well as give the paint job a more professional look.

POINT ON THE ROGUE VALLEY

Wonderfall! - Highway of Waterfalls

With up to 42 waterfalls along the way, it is understandable why the Rogue-Umpqua Scenic Byway is called the Highway of Waterfalls. A dedicated tourist could see up to 42 waterfalls on this drive from Roseburg to Central Point. A day trip can provide the opportunity to take in some of the most spectacular waterfalls in Oregon.

Heading east from Roseburg, Highway 138 travels high and deep into the Cascade Mountains. Just past Glide, the waterfall viewing areas begin with Deadline Falls, Susan Creek Falls (wheelchair accessible) and Fall Creek Falls, a tier type waterfall (trail rated difficult).

Further along highway 138 lie four waterfalls with great viewing areas. Toketee Falls is a two tier waterfall with a 40 foot and 80 foot drop. The trail (rated moderate to difficult) meanders through an old growth forest to a sturdy viewing platform. Watson Falls, a 272 foot plunge-type waterfall (the highest in Oregon) can be viewed from the parking lot; however the trail (rated difficult) provides a breathtaking view.

Continuing towards Central Point, several waterfalls can be viewed along the Rogue River. The Union Creek area has several waterfalls that are not extremely high, but the hiking in the area is beautiful, less difficult and dogfriendly.

Prospect has two waterfalls only a few hundred yards from each other. Mill Creek Falls, a 175 foot high waterfall, can be viewed from across the Rogue River Canyon. Barr Creek Falls, only a short distance away, is one of Southern Oregon's tallest at 200 feet.

The Rogue-Umpqua Scenic Byway with its waterfalls, old growth forests and hiking trails has something for evervone.
